Dictionary Definitions

fun•da•men•tal adjective

- 1 a: serving as an original or generating source: PRIMARY <a discovery fundamental to modern computers>
 - **b**: serving as **a basis** supporting existence or determining essential structure or function:

 BASIC
- a: of or relating to essential structure, function, or facts: RADICAL < fundamental change>
 b: adhering to fundamentalism
- 3: of, relating to, or produced by the lowest component of a complex vibration
- 4 : of central importance : PRINCIPAL < fundamental purpose>

fundamental adjective

- 1 forming or affecting the groundwork, roots, or lowest part of something <the fundamental rules of poetry>
 - syn basal, basic, bottom, foundational, meat-and-potatoes, primary, radical, underlying
- 2 syn ELEMENTAL 1, basic, elementary, essential, primitive, substratal, underlying
- 3 syn ESSENTIAL 2, cardinal, constitutive, vital rel indispensable, necessary, needful, requisite; dominant, paramount

fundamental noun

- 1 : something fundamental; *esp*: one of the minimum constituents without which a thing or a system would not be what it is
- 2 a: the principal musical tone produced by vibration (as of a string or column of air) on which a series of higher harmonics is based
 - **b**: the root of a chord
- 3: the harmonic component of a complex wave that has the lowest frequency and commonly the greatest amplitude

fun•da•men•tal•ism *noun*

- 1 a often cap: a movement in 20th century Protestantism emphasizing the literally interpreted Bible as fundamental to Christian life and teaching
 - **b**: the beliefs of this movement
 - **c**: adherence to such beliefs
- 2: a movement or attitude stressing strict (rigid) and literal adherence to a set of basic principles

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orthodox adjective (fr. $\dot{o}\rho\theta\dot{o}\varsigma + \delta\dot{o}\xi\alpha$)

 \dot{o} ρθ \dot{o} ς = literally straight, in a straight line; straight, right, upright \dot{o} όξ α = (fr. δοκ \dot{e} ω to think) opinion, judgment, view estimate

= to hold the right beliefs or to hold to the right way

fun·da·men·tal

adjective

- **1. a.** Of or relating to the foundation or base; elementary: the fundamental laws of the universe. **b.** Forming or serving as an essential component of a system or structure; central: an example that was fundamental to the argument. **c.** Of great significance or entailing major change: a book that underwent fundamental revision.
- **2.** *Physics*. **a.** Of or relating to the component of lowest frequency of a periodic wave or quantity. **b.** Of or relating to the lowest possible frequency of a vibrating element or system.
- 3. Music. Having the root in the bass: a fundamental chord.

noun

- 1. Something that is an essential or necessary part of a system or object.
- **2.** *Physics*. The lowest frequency of a periodically varying quantity or of a vibrating system.
