# **MUSIC & The Christian**

As you go through each lesson, look up the Bible verses and answer the questions in the blanks provided. When you are finished with this lesson you and your mentor will meet to discuss your answers and any questions you may have. This is not a pass/fail test, so answer honestly as you understand things. We want you to understand, not just to give the "right" answer.



Music has always held a wonderful place in the lives of God's people. Moses sang after crossing the Red Sea. King David wrote and sang many of the most wonderful songs of praise that have ever been written by man. Heaven itself rings with songs of praise to God.

What we do with music matters to God.

Music also poses a very real dilemma for the modern-day believer. We are faced with a broad spectrum of musical styles even within what is commonly considered to be "Christian music." Are all these musical styles ranging from "hard rock" to "classical" appropriate for me as a Christian? And what about the message and teachings communicated by these songs? We should carefully examine these and other questions in the light of God's Word.

Thoughtfully and prayerfully answer the following questions from the Scripture passages indicated. Be committed to obedience to God's Word rather than your personal preferences or emotional attachments to your favorite musical style.

- 1. Read John 4:24. What kind of worship does God require?

- 2. Is worship that violates either of the above truths *acceptable* to **God?** (*Check one*) **YES NO**
- 3. Read Psalm 29:2. Describe how God is to be worshipped.
- 4. Does sensual or irreverent music meet this qualification? (Check one) YES\_\_\_\_\_ NO\_\_\_\_ Why or Why not?
- 5. Read Exodus 15:2; Psalm 118:14; and Isaiah 12:2. Scripture teaches that sacred music is not all about the music itself; but is a vehicle to communicate something about God. What is our song to say about our God?
- 6. Read Colossians 3:16. What are some scriptural purposes for music?

#### 7. Read Ephesians 5:18-19. Does music seem to play a part in the Spiritfilled life? (*Check one*) YES\_\_\_\_\_ NO\_\_\_\_ Explain your answer.

**NOTE:** When the New Testament Scriptures were inspired in the first century A.D., many areas of Christian living and standards of holiness were addressed by general principles rather than by exhaustive lists of do's and don'ts. For example, questions of narcotics, dating standards and other areas were not all specifically spelled out, as is indicated by the fact that at the end of the description of the flesh in Galatians 5:21, Paul said, "And such like," leaving the believer to make discerning, Spiritled decisions about other areas of life.

8. Read Galatians 5:19-23. These verses describe the contrast between the flesh-filled life versus the Spirit-filled life. List any of the works of the flesh found in verses 19-21 which could be communicated through music.

9. Read Galatians 5:22-23. List the aspects of the fruit of the Spirit which could be communicated in music.

- 10. Read Psalm 98:4 & 100:1. Which one aspect of the fruit of the Spirit is often mentioned in connection with music?
- 11. Read II Kings 3:11-15. What happened in Elisha's spirit after he was ministered to by music? What was his frame of mind prior to the minstrel (musician) played or sang for him?

12. What do you think the minstrel's music was like in II Kings 3:15?

- 13. Read Galatians 5:21 again. One of the terms in this verse is "revellings" or "carousing" (*i.e. wild partying*). The Scripture gives and account of revelling in worship at Mount Sinai (see Exodus 32:17-26 & I Corinthians 10:7). What do you think the music in those passages sounded like, and what role to you think the music may have played in creating the atmosphere of reveling or carousing ?
- 14. Read I Samuel 16:18-23. David played music to minister to King Saul. What descriptions of carnality (the "old man" or the flesh) seemed to be in Saul's life and character before David ministered to him through music?

- **15.** Reread Galatians 5:22-23. Which specific aspects of the fruit of the Spirit from this passage did Saul exhibit after David's musical ministry?
- 16. Read I Corinthians 14:15. This passage defines the true nature of spiritual blessing. What two faculties of man are engaged when true spiritual blessing occurs?

- 17. Many have justified their use of music fashioned after the world's music by saying that it would be used for evangelism. Read the following verses and answer this question: "What is the true power of God for salvation?"

# Read the following quotes from reputable sources concerning Christian music:

- "It is difficult to comprehend how Christian musicians can talk about new creation, new life in Christ, resurrection values, righteousness, and purity, and proceed to wrap these lofty and spiritual concepts and values into a new-pagan, primitive, rhythmic, atheistic musical style copied directly from those who have declared war on these very values... Christian rock groups have brought into the church a music reflecting man's warfare against God." - Cynthia Maus in Christ and the Fine Arts
- "This particular sound and style in music did not originate with dedicated Christians who loved the Lord and felt impressed by the Holy Spirit to write it... To take the music that is inspired by the god of this world (Satan) and use it to worship our heavenly Father is totally contrary to what we are taught in the Word of God." Gordon Sears
- "The excuse that 'sometimes people are saved' is not excuse at all. People have been saved in concentration camps because God can bring good from evil, but this does not justify the evil." - Dr. Francis Shaeffer in Addicted to Mediocrity
- "The big question is whether pop music communicates the gospel in this way. We maintain that it does not, for the crucial reason that the medium has a distorting influence on the message." John Blanchard in **Pop Goes the Gospel**, p. 79.
- "The worship of God is not a branch of the entertainment industry. Worship is the entertainment of God, not the entertainment of man."
  - Dr. David C. Innes
- "If the singing of sacred music is for teaching and admonishing the child of God if it is to influence the Christian's spiritual life the music must reflect and reinforce Biblical truths." Dr. Frank Garlock in Music in the Balance, p. 54.

- "The new child of God sheds many things as he begins the Christian life. Many of the habits, actions, thoughts, activities, and desires which reflect the world are left behind as the Holy Spirit takes rule... The world's music ought to be one of those things left behind." Dr. Frank Garlock in Music in the Balance, p. 22.
- "If any style of music...creates feelings, ideas, emotions, values, or moods that are of, by, or for the unchanged way of life, such music is out of place in the changed life experience." - *Robert Berglund in A Philosophy of Church Music*
- "Far too much discussion of rock has focused on rock's effects upon man rather than its offensiveness to God. The result is that many are more interested in what God might permit than in how He might be pleased." *Richard Peck in Rock: Making Musical Choices*
- "But let us who hold to the authority of Scripture keep to that music which expresses praise to God in a way that is neither sensational nor sensual not attempting to gain the applause of the world but desiring the approval of God." *Dr. Tim Fisher in The Battle for Christian Music*
- "Rock, rhythm and blues, jazz, pop tunes, Bossa Nova, etc. are all products of the world. These [worldly Christian] musicians are taking the fleshly and are saying in effect, 'We are going to appeal to the spiritual.' It cannot be done... It is interesting to note that most of these styles have had their origin as dance music." Lowell Hart, former dance band musician in Satan's Music Exposed, p. 123.
