People from all over the world have paid good money to come here for even a visit this city for a short time, let alone live here!

God has placed you here! Have you considered your mission?

In the year 1996, 46% of the world's population resided in cities. Then it was estimated that by 2030, 61% of all people will be city-dwellers.

In 2023 some 56% of the world's population – 4.4 billion inhabitants – live in cities. This trend is expected to continue, with the urban population more than doubling its current size by 2050, at which point nearly 7 of 10 people will live in cities.¹

Since New Testament days, the city church has been the only hope for millions of people who had no hope in these crowded cities. Godly men and women who have committed themselves to minister through the city church have been used by the Lord to reach millions for the Lord.
